County Colorado-

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Began at Section Post on

 Thirteen (13) and Eighteen (18) 3d. Street (3) South
 Range Survey two (2)
 West and Section Thirteen
 Thirteen (13) and Thirteen
 (13) 3d. Street (3) South
 Range Survey three
 (13) West.

Established S. E. corner
of property ^{8 in square} fine post,
from which the Rocky
Mountain Cos Mill N.W.
corner bears S. W. W.

The N.E. corner was not
established as it came
inside of a Quartz Mill.
The N.W. corner, established
at a fine post 8 in square.
Six fine posts 8 in square
at intersections of outer
lines of property opposite
the angle of the fode -
the above outer lines

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were saw 25 feet from
and parallel with
the line of the ledge.

The position of the ledge
and bearings were
pointed out by Peter
C. Johnson the owner
thereof.

Nothing could be
judged of the probable
bearing of the ledge from
an examination of the
shaft on the same - that
being full of water to
the top.

Mr. Johnson reports
the principal shaft to
be fifty one feet deep -
thickened from the top
to solid walls a distance
of eighteen feet.

This shaft shows a

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choice of Seven feet in width - two feet of the same being of Iron-pyrites which Assays 8 min. per cent.

This Shaft in fact from West boundary of property -

There is also a Shaft on Discovery claim 25 feet deep tiered to solid walls a distance of about 18 feet -

Shows a choice of about four and a half feet -

Iron pyrites coming in through whole width -

There has never been anyone from this hole

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testid in a Mill-

This lode if it runs as pointed out by Mr Johnson differs from any other lode I have ever surveyed in the country - in that it makes so large a bend and does not return to the original general bearing.

That one fourth of the ground included in this property is covered by buildings among which are two Twenty Mills -
