6.5 ft high \times 6 ft. wide with open cut
at entrance 32 feet long, Cross cut No. 1
8 ft. \times 5.7 ft. \times 3.5 ft. deep, Cross cut No. 2
22 ft. long \times average width of 3.5 feet \times
6 ft deep for $\frac{1}{2}$ length and 3 feet deep
for remainder of length, - Also an
ore bin of logs 16.9 ft. \times 13.5 feet \times 13 feet
high and about 200 feet in length of
around averaging 15 feet in width.

Whereby certify
that these Improvements were made
